Double the Fun!

On April 14th and 15th, the Heartland Club hosted its 15th annual trial at the Douglas County Fairgrounds in Lawrence, KS. This year featured our first dual trial. The Sunflower Classic I was held on Saturday and another complete trial, the Sunflower Classic II was held on Sunday. A total of 241 terriers attended on Saturday and 219 stuck around for Sunday's event. Terriers traveled in from Arkansas, Colorado, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas, Wisconsin, Wyoming and Ontario, Canada. Visitors to past Heartland trials knew enough to come prepared for rain. What they didn't expect were snow showers on Friday night. Luckily, none of the snow stuck around for Saturday and the weekend featured nice weather. Conformation, Go-to-Ground, Racing, the Barn Hunt and Agility were run on both days. Super Go-to-Ground was only held on Sunday.

Our annual raffle raised over \$1200. The proceeds were split between the rescue efforts led by Kerry Dahlheim in Nebraska and the Heartland Club's general fund. Thanks to everyone who donated items and purchased tickets. We also held our first silent auction that brought in almost \$600 for the club.

With so many events and so many exhibitors, the club needs to pass along thanks to a number of people.

This was one of the events (the best one of course!) at the Purina Incredible Dog Challenge Regional. Twenty four great dogs and their owners came together to show the crowd what fun Jack Russell Racing is all about. This was the first time for the Incredible Dog Challenge to be in Wichita, it was billed as a headline venue on Saturday's River Fest. This is a very popular activity, the grandstands were completely full, getting to standing room only status. I would guess the crowd on hand at about 5,000 strong!

We had great weather and great racing.

Four heats, two semi-finals and of course, the final. The course was over jumps, but without fences. The action was fast and furious as Russell Racing tends to be. We had dogs hit the jumps and flip, generating many OOHS! and AAAHHS! from the crowd, we had pileups at the hole into the catch pen. We had several dogs that took the long way round the jumps (little cheaters they were) which the crowd loved. Of course, no dogs were injured and the owners all survived too. All in all, things went very well.

Tressie Cowen (Texas) and Bent Cedar Zoom Zoom won the event, Dave and Lisa Dernick (also from Texas) and River Oak Divot came in second. The first and second place dogs are now qualified for the National Finals of the

Incredible Dog Challenge, which will be held September 29 at Purina Farms just outside St. Louis.

Jack Russell's in the News

(Thanks to several members that passed this story on to the newsletter)

WELLINGTON, New Zealand — A plucky little Jack Russell Terrier named George stood like a giant against two marauding pit bulls and gave his own life to save five kids from the steel-trap jaws and razor-sharp teeth of the vicious pair. Local officials say the people who trained the pit bulls to kill may have fed the animals methamphetamines to make them even more deadly.

The tragedy unfolded a few weeks ago on New Zealand's North Island, in the town of Manaia. A group of children — and George — were walking back from a trip to the candy store.

Out of nowhere, the two pit bulls lunged at them. One of the kids told the local paper that George never backed down against the pit bulls. He doggedly refused to let them get at the smallest child, a 4-year-old.

"George tried to protect us by barking and rushing at them, but they started to bite him — one on the head and the other on the back," Richard Rosewarne said. "We ran off crying and some people saw what was happening and rescued George."

Sadly, it was too late to save the little 9-year-old terrier. The veterinarian who treated George said the dog's wounds were the worst he'd seen. Putting him down was the only option.

For Allan Gay, George's owner, the loss is especially devastating. He lives alone and George had been his faithful companion for seven of his nine years, inheriting the pup when neighbors moved away.

"These two pitbulls rushed up and were going for the little boy," Gay said, choking back tears. "George went for them; it's what he would do. He didn't stand a chance, but I reckon he saved that boy from being chewed up. If it wasn't for George, those kids would have copped it."

Gay said he had been receiving phone calls non-stop from relatives and news media since word got out about George's heroics.

The pit bulls, meanwhile, were found Tuesday and turned over to local officials, who said they would be destroyed. Officials also are investigating reports that the dogs could have been given methamphetamines to make them more aggressive and very unpredictable. The local animal control officer stated that the pit bulls he usually deals with are naturally aggressive because of the type of people they are with. He believes they keep the pit bulls and train them to be aggressive because they don't like visitors, and he presumes they have something to hide.

Gay and the kids built a makeshift memorial to their little hero. "George was brave," Gay said, as each of the kids held a photo of the little pup they'll never forget. "He took them on and he's not even a foot high. ... He jumped in on them; he tried to keep them off."

He gave his life showing the bravery and loyal nature of the Jack Russell Terrier.
